

WILLS ARE FILED IN TWO DULUTH ESTATES

Samuel Oreckovsky, 56, who died here Feb. 7, 1910, left \$100 to be divided evenly between the Talmud Torah and the Bickur Ghaulin, two Duluth charitable organizations, according to his will filed in probate court yesterday. The remainder of his estate, valued at \$1,000 in Duluth real estate, is left to his widow for her support and at her death is to be divided among five children. The widow, Mrs. Esther Oreckovsky, seeks to be appointed executrix of the estate.

Enok Jorgensen filed a petition asking to be appointed administrator of the estate left by his wife, Ingeborg Jorgensen, 48, who died here Sept. 13, 1913. The property consists of a lot in Duluth worth \$1,000 and 80 acres of St. Louis county land valued at \$1,500. There are three children.
