

Symposium on Jews Given at Temple

The two hundred and sixty-first anniversary of the coming of the Jews to America was celebrated yesterday afternoon by Temple Emanuel Aid society with a symposium on "Jews in America." A history of the Jews in this country showed the different activities in which they have been engaged to show that they are patriots of America, and this was included in three papers, "Landing of the Jewish Pilgrims," by Mrs. Fannie Mondshine; "The Jews in America Up to 1865," by Mrs. H.
