

ONE KILLED, 12 HURT; CAR LEAPS INTO DITCH

Virginians on Way to Jewish Picnic Are Victims of Accident—Machine Was Crowded.

VIRGINIA, Aug. 24.—Simo Hostin, 6-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Hostin, was killed, and Samuel Milavetz, Paul Hostin, Lillie Segal, Johnnie Segal, Monroe Shanedling, Leona Lippman, Bernard Dorfman, Fanny Tousin, Phillip Booth, Annie Cohen, Daniel Milavetz and John Berek, bruised and injured in an automobile accident this noon on the Adams hill between Virginia and Eveleth. All are children with the exception of Samuel Milavetz and Paul Hostin, local merchants, both of whom are in a serious condition.

The car was driven by Monroe Shanedling, the son of Julius Shanedling, a clothing merchant of Virginia. Simo Hostin was taken to the Moore hospital at Eveleth, where he died after being there five minutes. His father, Paul Hostin, was rushed to the McIntyre hospital in Virginia, seriously injured. Phillip Booth, the 10-year-old son of Rabbi N. B. Booth and Mrs. Booth, sustained a broken leg. Lillie Segal has a broken collarbone.

The party was en route to Ely

lake, where a picnic was being held by the Jewish people of the city. Monroe Shanedling had taken one load of people to the lake and returned to Virginia for his second load.

The car was going about 20 miles an hour and the driver turned to the edge of the road to avoid running over several pieces of glass in the road. He was at the top of the hill and the car left the road, turned over and then righted itself. The Hostin boy was crushed to death. He was picked up by Edward Hatch, an Eveleth man who was driving past, and taken to the Eveleth hospital.

The car was brought to the city by Elmer Lindsay, motorcycle policeman, and Charles Ward, a chauffeur. As the machine was being placed in the garage, they cranked it and it backfired and caught fire. The local fire department was called to extinguish the blaze.

Monroe Shanedling, the driver, sustained injuries in an automobile accident last fall, while making a trip to Ely with the Virginia high school football team.
