Four Duluth Selection Boards Will Be Exempt Today From Duty.

1,446 MEN ARE CERTIFIED

Boards Rest Today.

Today the members of the four selection boards will be exempt from duty. They will resume their labors tomorrow. The third and fourth boards have a considerable distance yet to go before the quota in their districts is filled.

The first district board has certified its full quota for service, 181. Aside from cleaning up clerical odds and ends the members of this board, while legally in service, will not have anything more to do until the government is ready for another call for men for a big unit at present hardly more than on paper. The second district board is nearing the end of its labors under the first call for men.

Martin Is in Service.

George S. Martin, 2130 East Third street, a registrant in district No. 4, was reported yesterday to the board of that district as in the service as a second lieutenant in the quartermaster's corps at Fort Snelling. This adds another to the remarkably high number of registrants in that district who entered the service shortly after registering.

One of the registrants who appeared last night was temporarily rejected. He will be given the "second time over" before long. He was not quite "right," and yet he was not "wrong" enough to justify a final turndown.

Seven Fall to Appear.

One registrant was cited for further examination. Five of the 16 rejected were dismissed because they were aliens. Seven registrants failed to appear. It would be legal for the board to automatically certify them for service. They will have to produce mighty good excuses for their non-appearance, and those excuses will have to be forthcoming shortly. Otherwise, they will be soldiers charged with giving military service to the United States and being off duty without leave. That, of course, is serious business.

The board will consider longer the registration of Len Song, Chinese, born in this country, and employed in a Duluth Chinese restaurant. The registrant claims exemption because of "three children and a mamma in China." Some time ago the government decreed that dependents not in the United States could not be recognized as a valid cause for exemption. There are voluminous documents in this case, and in order that no injustice be done, it was agreed with Chairman Mahoney that a ruling be not made until the statutes be given closest study.

The third district board is anxious to ascertain the whereabouts of Magnus Fraser of 6451 Lawrence avenue, Chicago. The board of division 17 of Chicago requested that Board No. 3 of Duluth examine him, as he had written to his home board to that effect. The Duluth draft officials will accommodate the Chicago board and Fraser, if it can locate him.
