## AIDED IN DULUTH

### Jews Who Hear Dr. Scheinkin Buy \$4,000 Interest in Holy Land.

Jubilant over the declaration of Lord Balfour of England that that country would give its support to the Zionist movement to establish a fatherland for the Jews of the world in Palestine, Jews of Duluth bought \$1,000 worth of stock in that country at a meeting at the Adas Israel synagogue last night which was addressed by Dr. Scheinkin and Dr. Maurice Lefkowitz.

Dr. Scheinkin, who has been in Palestine, told of the great climatic advantages of Palestine and of its value as an agricultural land, but dwelt more on the great revival of Jewish life and ideals that this would bring about.

"This war is being fought to give the small nations an equal footing with the larger nations. Palestine is one of the small nations for which this war is being fought," he stated. "We have a right to live as we wish, we have a right to observe our own religion, and to cultivate our own language. No one has right to impose on the Jews. This was done years ago, but now the world is at war to give such people and such nations rights that people in greater numbers and mightier nations enjoy."

Dr. Scheinkin was followed by Dr. Lefkowitz, who declared that it was a privilege to live at a time "when we are making history every hour. But the greatest privilege is the privilege of the Jews to live at a time when we are about to see realized the dream and goal of the Jews for the past 2,000 years," he said referring to the attitude of England.

A committee will be organized

later which will arrange for the quarterly payments on the \$250 investment, and which will endeavor to interest other local Jews in the proposition.
