

# GAVE LIQUOR TO BOY, SENTENCED

George Jacobson Is Found  
Guilty of Causing Theodore  
Babcock's Intoxication.

## HORWITZ IS ARRESTED

Charged With Permitting  
Boys to Frequent His  
Pool Room.

George Jacobson, who was arrested Feb. 5, with John Strom, charged with giving liquor to Theodore Babcock, a 13-year-old boy, was arraigned yesterday in the West Duluth branch municipal court, found guilty and sentenced to 75 days at the work farm.

The testimony presented yesterday afternoon was practically the same as entered in the Strom trial on Thursday. Theodore Babcock testified that Saturday night, Feb. 3, he was given two drinks of whisky by the two defendants which resulted in placing him in an intoxicated condition. The boy's mother, however, testified that she found no odor of alcohol on his breath when she found him.

A number of witnesses were called in rebuttal by the defense.

### Notice of Appeal.

Notice of appeal in the Strom case has been given. Judge Lanners allowed a stay of sentence of 20 days to permit of Jacobson filing an appeal. He was released on \$150 bail.

David Horwitz, proprietor of the Zenith bowling alleys and poolroom was arrested yesterday charged with allowing minors in his place of business. Theodore Babcock while on the stand in the other cases named several 13 and 14-year-old boys who were in the place at the time of his alleged downfall. Horwitz pleaded not guilty and his trial was set for next week.
