

ASTHMATIC MUST SERVE SENTENCE

Court Disregards Plea Made by Polinsky, Violator of Liquor Law.

Because he was suffering from asthma Michael Polinsky tried unsuccessfully yesterday to prove to the court that he could not endure a jail sentence and lack of fresh air without it proving fatal to him.

Earlier yesterday Alma B. Welland, the first woman to be arrested for blind-pigging this year, pleaded guilty on information filed with the county attorney's office and was fined \$50 with a suspended sentence of 60 days in the county jail.

Husband Fined, Sentenced.

It was not easy for her husband, Arthur Welland, however, who assisted in the operation of a road house at Rice Lake, an alleged unlicensed drinking place, and when he pleaded guilty to an indictment, he was sentenced by Judge Dancer to 60 days in jail in addition to paying a \$50 fine.
