Highest scholarship honors of the graduating class of Central high school were won by a girl. Bessie Levine, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. H. Levine, 524 Lake avenue North, procured the honor by having an average of 94.188 for four years of school work. Four other students had a grade slightly over 93 and 16 had marks between 90 and 92.

Three of the 21 honor students were boys. Emanuel Cook had the highest average of any of the boys in the class and came second with an average of 93.98, less than one point behind Miss Levine. Susie Lovald had an average of 93.406 and would have attained third place but, according to Principal Leonard Young, was prevented from taking the place because she had attended another school a year and a half prior to her
