

RED CROSS GETS BIG AID ON MESABA RANGE

Village of Buhl With 2,000 Population Gives More Than \$3,000 to Cause.

HIBBING RAISES \$15,000

Chisholm, Coleraine, Bovey, Eveleth, Virginia and Keewatin Oversubscribed.

HIBBING, June 25.—An oversubscription of \$5,000 was reported tonight by L. O. Kirby, treasurer of the local Red Cross. Hibbing's quota was set at \$10,000 but Hibbing showed its spirit by subscribing \$15,000. Employees of the Oliver Iron Mining company subscribed over \$4,000. Employees of independent mining companies also did their "bit" in the campaign. The majority of the pledges came in \$1, \$2 and \$5 amounts.

A dance was given at the Armory tonight for the Red Cross. Three hundred couples attended.

BUHL, June 25.—With less than 1,000 inhabitants, Buhl subscribed \$3,150 to the Red Cross fund or more than \$1.50 per inhabitant. The campaign here was conducted under the direction of the Buhl defense council and the solicitation was carried on by committees appointed by the council.

CHISHOLM, June 25.—Chisholm gave \$9,350 to the Red Cross campaign which closed today, according to figures reported to J. P. Vaughan, treasurer of the local Red Cross campaign committee. A benefit show was given at the Rex theater, 50 per cent going to the Red Cross. Chisholm's quota was \$8,000.

COLERAINE, June 25.—The committee soliciting subscriptions for Red Cross week has finished its work. Local Secretary N. Trabilcock reported that over \$3,000 had been collected. This exceeds the Coleraine and Bovey allotment by \$500. This district has already furnished more than its allotment of volunteers for the army and navy and now exceeds its share in the contributions. It should also be noted that no slackers were found.

EVELETH, June 25.—Contributions to the Red Cross to date total \$7,500, exceeding expectations of all interested in the campaign. This amount is \$500 in excess of the sum called for by the national committee.

Most of the city employes donated a day's wages to the cause. A final report of the campaign will be made tomorrow at a city hall meeting of the committee in charge.

VIRGINIA, June 25.—Red Cross donations tonight passed the \$13,000 mark in the windup of the campaign for \$15,000, according to a report by Treasurer Douglas Greeley. Jewish women realized \$75 at a candy sale and vaudeville performance at the Royal theater last night.

When reports from all committees working in the campaign are received Greeley believes the \$15,000 sought here will have been oversubscribed.

KEEWATIN, June 25.—The Red Cross campaign ended with heavy contributions. The total is not definite but it is believed \$1,000
