

CAMPAIGN FOR JEWISH WAR FUND SOON TO START

Committees Named and Headquarters Secured for Drive Next Week.

Committees in charge of the Jewish war relief fund are busy with preparations for the 1918 campaign which will start Sunday, June 9 and continue for a week. A meeting will be held Thursday night to complete plans for the drive in which leading Jews throughout the city are taking an active interest.

Headquarters of the campaign will be maintained at 816 Tower avenue and a complete canvass of the city will be made. Those interested say that the quota of \$7,000 for Superior will be easily oversubscribed.

Officers of the organization, which represents all the Jewish societies in the city, are as follows: Julius Cohan, chairman; A. Siegal, vice chairman; Alice Holzberg, financial secretary; Robert Jacobs, treasurer and E. I. Lurye, recording secretary.

The reception committee comprises Mrs. Julius Weingarten, Julius Cohen, S. Y. Josephs, E. I. Lurye and Herman Aronsohn. Publicity committee: C. Marcus, H. Ielbovitz and M. Sher. Committee on halls: A. Holzberg, S. Y. Josephs and Mrs. R. Edelman.

During the week there will be several addresses by prominent Jews, among those from out of town being S. Neveleff of the Central Jewish Relief committee, New York city; Judge Pam of the United States court of appeals, and Rabbi M. Lefkowitz of Duluth. Judge Pam will speak at a mass meeting on Sunday the opening day of the campaign.
