

# THIRD CITY DRAFT BOARD COMPILES QUOTA TO ENTRAIN

## Duluth Calls for Next Week May Not Be Affected by Quota Ban in Burned Area.

Although it has been intimated that the men ordered to go to Camps Cody and Forrest next week may be detailed for relief work in the burned-over district of this state, local draft boards have received no official confirmation. Board members are prepared to take appropriate action if the orders are received.

Duluth draft board No. 3 has prepared a list of men to entrain for Camp Cody, Deming, New Mexico, Monday at 1:55 p.m. The list includes seven men who are out of the city, five of whom may not be able to return in time to go with this contingent and may be sent from their present locations. Twenty-three will fill the quota and the 12 last named are registrants of June 5, 1918.
