

Duluth Relatives Seek Information About Abe Shapiro

THAT the Abraham Shapiro, reported in a Chicago dispatch yesterday morning as having jumped into the Chicago river and drowned, was not Abraham Shapiro, a Duluth soldier, age 21, was the best opinion relatives of the latter were able to form last night. The Duluth man is a member of the One Hundred and Sixty-first depot brigade at Camp Grant, the same detachment mentioned in the dispatch from Chicago as the unit to which the dead soldier belonged.

Mrs. Harry Gram of Hibbing, a sister of the Duluthian, told the News Tribune last night over the long distance telephone that she had received Saturday afternoon a telegram from her brother, dated at Camp Grant at 4 p. m., reading "All O. K." Another sister, Mrs. Joseph Boznu of 119 Seventh avenue West, Duluth, telephoned the News Tribune a few minutes later asking for information, and the two families were given the facts then at hand.

Whether a comrade impersonated Shapiro in going to Chicago, or whether there was a mere confusion of identity owing to similar names, was not learned.
