

POLICE ARREST TRUCK

DRIVER; CONFISCATE BEER

Tony Stauber, 22, was arrested yesterday by patrolman Mahlin, West End policeman, and 11 cases of beer, carried in the truck driven by Stauber, were confiscated. Stauber was charged with the illegal possession of liquor.

This is, say the police, the first arrest on this charge since St. Louis county became "dry," March 15. Stauber's arrest is similar to that of several deliverymen for Superior brewing concerns who were arrested shortly after Duluth became "dry" on July 1, 1917. "The arrest," says Chief McKercher, "was made on the advice of the city attorney, regardless of the fact that breweries, under the county "dry" laws, are allowed until April 1 to complete the delivery of orders."

Henry Cohen, proprietor of a confectionery store on East Superior street, who was arrested Thursday night by Chief McKercher and was charged with running a blind pig, pleaded not guilty in municipal court yesterday. His case was continued until April 6. Bail was set at \$100.
