## Chisholm Gives and Mountain Iron Plans Junior-Senior Af- fairs; Present Tableaux.

CHISHOLM, April 13.—The Junior-senior ball took place here tonight at the high school. It was attended by 1000 couples. The hall was decorated with small American flags and in one corner of the hall the orchestra was completely hidden from view by an improvised garden of palms and ferns. At either end of the room was a shield representing the classes of 1918 and 1917.

The orchestra played "The Star Spangled Banner," during the tableau, while those present stood. The funds derived from the ball will be given to the Chisholm Red Cross.
