

ONE COW FIGURES BIG IN FEDERAL COURT ACTION

One cow and one electric railway coach figure prominently in a damage suit filed by Lizzie Edelstein against the Mesaba Railway company in United States district court.

Mrs. Edelstein was driving her cow home on the evening of Aug. 29, 1917, according to the complaint, when one of the electric coaches of the company approached down one of Hibbing's streets. The operator, the complaint alleges, "operated same against and upon the cow owned by the plaintiff in such a manner as to strike, push, or throw said cow with great force and violence against the plaintiff in such manner that the cow was instantly killed and both bones of the plaintiff's leg were fractured below the knee.

The plaintiff asks \$15,000 as damages, \$100 for the cow and \$300 for physicians' and hospital bills. The case was transferred from district court.
