Cecil, Earl Brownlow, Neville Chamberlain, Hal Caine, The Bishop of London, the Catholic Archbishop of Liverpool, Sir Conan Doyle, Editor Steed of the London "Times," Prof. Gardner, editor of the London "Daily News" and, Gilbert K. Chesterton.
