

# TRACK MEET TO BE HELD HERE ON JUNE 7

## At Least Six Schools Will Be Represented--Karon Elected D. C. H. S. Captain.

The 1919 Head of the Lakes inter-scholastic conference track meet will be held in Duluth June 7. Every high school in the conference may



enter. The date and the awarding of the meet was set at a gathering of officials of the conference held last night in the boys' department of the Y. M. C. A. Every high school with the exception of Proctor, had a representative at last night's

meeting. The schools represented were: Duluth Central, Denfeld, Cathedral, Superior Central and Nelson Dewey.

Although the meet was awarded to Duluth the place where it will be run off has not been decided. Should the track at Thirtieth avenue West and Third street be completed by that date the affair will be staged there. If not it will be held on Third street and having Lake avenue as a starting point. Duluth Central stages all her interclass meets on Third street and although it wouldn't be as good as the new track, now being constructed, it will do.

### Agree on Points.

It was agreed to have two starters in the races and three in the field events. This means that at least five entries will represent each school at the meet. The judging will be done the same as it was last year, the first four men being placed. The regular point system of 5, 3, 2 and 1 will be used. In this way it is hoped that the weaker schools will be given a chance to finish well up toward the front. There will be four prizes for the individual winners. The first in each event will receive a gold medal and the second a silver medal, third and fourth places will be given ribbons.

The hand grenade event was dropped and it is expected that low hurdles will take its place in the regular, scheduled events of the meet.

### The Events.

The events are as follows: One hundred, 220, 440, 880-yard and mile runs, shot put, discus, pole vault high and broad jumps. There will be three relays, the half mile, mile and medley races. The medley race will count in the possession of the Head of the Lakes conference trophy. Duluth Central won this trophy last year and Superior Central finished second.

In talking over the prospects of each of the schools, Duluth and Superior Centrals seem to be the favorites. Cathedral is doubtful if it will have any entries this season as the war hit that school rather hard. Nelson Dewey and Denfeld are the dark horses of the conference and may cause some trouble to the favorites.

### Karon Elected Captain.

After four years of faithful work in all branches of athletics, Maurice Karon has finally been awarded the honor that he deserves. He was elected captain of Duluth Central high school track team at a meeting of the "D" men held yesterday morning in the assembly room of the school.

Karon has been on the track team since his freshmen days and this is his final year as a student at Duluth Central as he will graduate this June. Karon has played football, basket ball, hockey and represented the red and white team on the cinder track every year he has been at the school. He is one of the greatest all around athletes.

The outlook of the D. C. H. S. team is very promising for this year. There will be at least eight "D" men back, including Karon, J. O'Neill, another three letter man, Finkelstein, Buckman, Niscious, Burns, Whitten and Tuttle. There also are promising candidates among the new students.
