

Divorce Cases Hold Sway on November Calendar of Court to Convene Next Week

200 Cases to Be Called by Judge Fesler; Term Starts Wednesday.

Judge Bert Fesler yesterday announced that plans have been completed for the calling of the November term of district court on Wednesday at 10 a. m. There are about 200 cases, half of which are new and half continued from the September term. Judge Fesler will hold court for naturalization proceedings on Friday, Nov. 5. He anticipates that the 150 naturalization cases scheduled will require two days. For this reason the Moose Lake fire test cases have been set over from Nov. 3 to Nov. 8.

A deluge of new cases flooded the district court clerk's office yesterday, the last day for filing notices for the November term. Divorce cases were numerous.

Virginia Landry, age 55, filed suit for divorce from Louis Landry, age 54, on the grounds of cruel treatment. They were married on Oct. 26, 1886, and had 10 children, four of whom are living.

On Oct. 16, she charges the defendant took the phonograph and other household goods out of their home at 2314 West First street. Judge Edward Freeman signed an order directing the defendant to abstain from molesting further the furniture and requiring him to appear in court on Saturday to show cause why he should not be required to pay temporary alimony and attorney's fees.

E. C. Stovern, age 26, filed suit for divorce from Hazel Stovern, age 24, on the grounds of desertion on Aug. 7, 1919. They were married at Grand

for injuries claimed to be sustained when the defendant's auto struck her and a baby carriage on the sidewalk on Twenty-seventh avenue West on July 26. Charles Erickson against Harry Schapery for \$1,050 for loss of comfort and happiness of his wife's companionship due to injuries in an auto accident; Frank A. Rich, Howard Rich, age 7, and Mrs. Ellen A. Rich in three suits against J. G. Viche for injuries sustained when the defendant is said to have struck and overturned the auto in which the plaintiffs were riding. Damages asked are \$1,210, \$3,600 and \$10,200 respectively.

Reginauld D. Graham filed suit for \$8,000 damages against the city of Duluth and Andrew Nelson for damages caused by a gas explosion in his home on Aug. 7, which he alleges was caused by negligence of the defendants who were engaged in repairing the street on West Eighth street between Fifty-seventh and Fifty-eighth avenues West.

Judge H. A. Dancer yesterday granted a divorce and custody of three children to Rosy Monteith in the case against Robert Monteith, charging desertion in March, 1917. They were married in Lakota, N. D., on Feb. 12, 1901.

Thressa Harris, age 31, filed suit for divorce from Warren B. Harris age 40, on the grounds of cruel treatment. They were married on Nov 3 1905. Notes of issue for the November term were filed in the cases of Florence Redding against Denson P. Redding, Freda M. Miller against Thomas Miller, Alice Carter against Arthur C. Carter.

Alvin M. Sly, age 23, filed suit for divorce from Clara Sly, age 16, on the grounds of cruel treatment. They were married on May 15. Plaintiff charges defendant is now serving sentence at the industrial home. Affidavit of no answer was filed in the suit of Oscar Wickstrom against Anna Johnson Wickstrom.

Damage suits filed included Mamie Lindquist against Otto William Perleberg for \$3,091 for alleged injuries sustained when struck by the defendant's auto; Ellen E. Erickson against Harry Schapery for \$5,000 damages
