

# D. C. H. S. CLASS TO HONOR MEN WHO SERVED IN WAR

## Will Present Bronze Tablet Bear- ing Names of Warriors at Ceremonies Today.

A bronze memorial tablet bearing the names of four faculty members and former students of the Central high school who served in the army, navy and marine corps, will be presented to the school by the class of 1919 at chapel services this morning.

One faculty member, C. L. Allensworth, and one student, Herbert Hansen, died in service. Several have died since their return from the service, but none were killed.

### Leonard Young to Speak.

The presentation exercises will commence at 8:25 a. m. The High School orchestra will play the "Russian Mazurka" and the boys' chorus, accompanied by Florence Hector, will sing at the opening exercises. Oliver Korby of the class of 1919 will unveil and present the memorial tablet. Leonard Young, principal of the school, will make the speech of acceptance.

The tablet is a solid cast in liberty bronze, 25 by 36 inches. It will be hung in the corridor of the first floor of the school, opposite the principal's office.

### Tribute to Boys.

On the tablet is this inscription: "Duluth Central High School Honor Roll. A tribute to the boys who left this school to serve in the World war, 1917-1919."

On the tablet are the names only of those who were students in the school when the war broke out. It does not contain the names of graduates in service.
