

ACCUSED MAN TO COME HERE

Morris Cohen Arrested in Madison on Tip by Brother-in-Law; Is Wanted in Duluth.

MADISON, Wis., March 12.—Morris Cohen, 35, of everywhere in general and nowhere in particular, alleged to be wanted in Duluth for issuing worthless checks is lodged in the police station here after being delivered to officers at the Park hotel by his brother-in-law a traveling salesman of Chicago. He will be taken to Duluth tomorrow morning.

The two men met by chance in the hotel yesterday. The brother-in-law told the police he had resolved that if he ever laid eyes on Cohen again he would cause his arrest.

Cohen was ready to check out after only a day's visit in Madison, when the officers arrived he had just sold a gold watch to a bell boy for \$10 and a gold ring, set with three white sapphires to another.

He did not know his brother-in-law was registered at the hotel until the latter appeared with the police. Cohen is dressed in an elegant check suit, white vest and the best quality silk shirt.

In his wallet he was carrying nearly \$700 or \$800 in bills, according to the bell boys but only had \$168.50 when searched at the police station. On his finger he wears a diamond ring valued at \$1,500.

"I'm sure I'll come out all right he said when I get to Duluth. There is no use in worrying. I'm all right."
