

# FINE YOUTH FOR THEFT OF CANDY

## Morris Cohen Is Held for Grand Jury Investigation; Other Mu- nicipal Court Cases.

Herbert M. Lynch, aged 18, was fined \$50 and costs and placed on parole for six months by Judge Frank H. Cutting in municipal court yesterday after pleading guilty to a charge of stealing three boxes of candy from the Northern Pacific railway.

Morris Cohen, charged with passing a worthless check of \$82 on a local jeweler, was held for the grand jury and bail was fixed at \$500. He is alleged to have given the check for a gold watch with diamond setting, a lady's silver wrist watch, a boy's

watch and a gold dinner ring.

Roy Gonvea was found guilty of aiding in procuring intoxicating liquor and was sentenced to 60 days at the county work farm. Adolph Johnson forfeited \$20 bail when he failed to appear on a charge of drunkenness. Berger Halseth pleaded guilty to a charge of drunkenness and was fined \$22 with an option of spending 20 days at the work farm.
