

LIQUOR HEARINGS ARE ADJOURNED BY JUDGE PARKER

Seven Dry-Law Cases Placed on the Municipal Court Docket for Trial.

Seven liquor cases, in addition to half a dozen others, were brought before municipal court yesterday. Most of them were adjourned until Sept. 9 and 10. Judge F. S. Parker, after several weeks' vacation, resumed his duties yesterday.

Mr. and Mrs. Frank Vanna, charged with conducting a disorderly house, appeared for trial in the morning and demanded a hearing by jury. A jury was drawn, although but three men could be obtained. The defendants consented to this arrangement and testimony was taken until 4 o'clock in the afternoon. The jury then returned a verdict of not guilty and defendants were discharged.

Released on Bail.

Jack Olson, Frank Fisher and Ole Anderson were arrested and brought to trial for alleged liquor ordinance violations. Their cases were adjourned to Sept. 8, 9 and 10, and they were released on \$300 bail each.

Stephen Androski, charged with receiving stolen goods, was bound over to circuit court for trial and bail fixed at \$500. George Perrault, charged with violating the liquor ordinance, will be tried Sept. 10. He was released on the customary \$300 bail.

James C. Bell, Tony Teoli and Swan Olson were charged with violating the liquor ordinance and released on bond, after pleading not guilty. They will be tried Thursday and Friday.

Ella Howard was released on \$200 bail. She pleaded not guilty to charges of operating a disorderly house. A. J. Burgraff also pleaded not guilty to the same charge and will be tried Sept. 10. Bail was placed at \$300.

Burglary Charged.

Ed Herrick, up on a charge of burglary, demanded an examination of his case, which was granted. Bail was fixed at \$500. Andrew Sislo, facing burglary charges, is held on \$500 bond awaiting the arrival of a private railway detective to take him in custody. Morris Greenblatt, charged with violating the liquor ordinance, is held on bail.

Chester Rookey and Ed Johnson, arrested for violating the traffic ordinance, paid fines of \$13 when convicted yesterday morning. A. C. Hanke forfeited \$15 bail when he failed to appear on a charge of speeding. John Olson and Gust Kampau were charged with being drunk, and the former was fined \$10; Kampau forfeited \$10 bail.

Jack Whittaker, charged with running a gambling joint, forfeited \$100 bail when he did not appear to answer the charges. Three alleged inmates, Ray Smith, Joe White and Jack Brown, failed to appear and also forfeited \$15 bail.
