

JEWS OF DULUTH EXCHANGE HAPPY NEW-YEAR GREETINGS

"Le Shono Tovo," the happy New Year greeting of the Jewish people, was in order yesterday. These ancient Hebraic words are fraught with significance to the orthodox mind, expressing the wish literally "for a good year." "Gam Atem," ("the same to you") is the correct response.

Orthodox Jewish synagogues of the city were filled to capacity during morning and evening services in observance of the new year. At Adas Israel synagogue, Third avenue East and Third street, and in the Talmud Tohra annex, worshippers gathered during the day to attend the almost continuous services.

Cantor Braverman, with a choir of boys, conducted the prayer singing. Rabbi I. Teplitz delivered the Rosh Hashanah, or New Year sermon. Services also were conducted by Dr. Maurice Lefkovits in Temple Emanuel, Seventh avenue East and Second street. For the orthodox Jews of the world, the New Year observance will be concluded tomorrow evening at sundown with special services.
