HADASSAH TEA

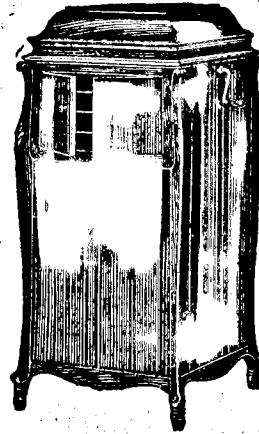

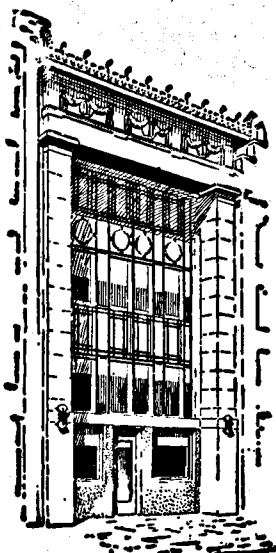
