

SCHOOL SPEAKERS WILL CONTEST AT HIBBING TONIGHT

Boys and Girls of 14 Towns to Compete for Trip to Minneapolis.

HIBBING, March 3.—Tomorrow afternoon at 2:30 o'clock in the Hibbing high school gymnasium, the boys' declamatory contest in which 14 schools of the district will contest will take place. The winner will participate in a state contest at Minneapolis.

Each entry tomorrow will talk for eight minutes. Tomorrow evening at 8 o'clock the girls' declamation contest will be held. Representatives of 14 schools will compete. The winner also will go to Minneapolis as a representative from the district. Judges for the contest are: Superintendent Fleming of Tower, Miss Williams, speaking instructor of Ely and Miss White, speaking instructor of the Duluth Central high school.
