EAST JEWS A "MENACE" TO GERMANY, JEW ASSERTS
Berlin (J. C. B.)—That the immigrants, including the Jews, from Eastern Europe are "intolerable," constituting an undesirable element, whose continued migration to Germany whose continued migration and continued migration to Germany whose continued migration to Germany the government should stop, is the keynote of an article by Friedrich Neumann, President of the Federation of National German Jews, writing in the influential "Koelnische Zeitung."

The Nationalist Jews, Herr Neumann states, are enemies of the German culture. They admit that they are no part of the German people and should not be admitted, therefore, to any official positions in Germany.

Herr Neumann calls on the German people to particularly combat the

Herr Neumann calls on the German people to particularly combat the Zionists' influence. At a certain Zionist meeting, in Berlin, Neumann complains, speeches were delivered by three Eastern Jews, among them a Polish Jewish deputy, appealing to the German Jews to send money to Palestine. Mr. Neumann insists the German government should see to it that no money is taken out of the Vaterland for foreign purposes.

Herr Neumann expresses special

Herr Neumann expresses special indignation over the warm welcome which the Berlin Jewish community gave to Dr. Weizmann, saving that this reception was an insult to the German people.

President Ebert is scored for hav-

ing received Dr. Weizmann, this being due, in his opinion, to the latter's close relations with the British government.
