

# JEWS ORGANIZE NORTHERN GROUP OF B'NAI B'RITH

The Northern council of the B'nai B'rith was organized last night at the annual B'nai B'rith day meeting of Covenant lodge at Covenant hall. The council takes in the territory of northern Wisconsin and northern Minnesota. A. B. Kapplin, president of Covenant lodge, was elected president of the council.

The following delegates were named to attend the next meeting of the council, which will be held at Eveleth in January: Samuel Nides of Hibbing; M. K. Baer of Virginia; Harry L. Levant of Eveleth; Dr. I. M. Harris of Superior, and Mr. Kapplin. Dr. Harris was named vice president and Mr. Nides secretary and treasurer.

The program in honor of the day opened at 3 p. m. with an initiation of a class of 20 candidates for membership in the grand lodge. Following the initiation Gustavus Loevinger of St. Paul, who is grand lodge president, delivered an address at the Paramount radio broadcasting station. The address was broadcast over the country and was received at Covenant hall.

Mr. Loevinger, Rabbi J. I. Meyerowitz of St. Paul, and the delegates to the council were the guests of honor of the grand lodge at a dinner at the Spalding hotel, following which Rabbi Meyerowitz and Mr. Loevinger delivered addresses at Covenant hall.

Selection by Segal's orchestra followed the program and 300 persons engaged in dancing. A buffet supper was served at 10:30 p. m.

Mr. Loevinger discussed the work of the order and the plans of the grand lodge convention to be held in Duluth next July. Mr. Loevinger will turn to St. Paul this morning and Rabbi Meyerowitz will visit several days in Duluth as the guest of Rabbi Alvin S. Luchs.
