

DULUTH AUTO SHOW WILL CLOSE IN BLAZE OF GLORY TONIGHT

BIGGEST ATTENDANCE OF WEEK VISITS ARMORY, IT LOOKS LIKE BIG NIGHT TONIGHT, ALL SAY

The largest attendance of the week was recorded last night, when all available street cars were taxed to capacity to transport visitors to and from the eighth annual Duluth automobile show at the Armory.

Coincident with the bulge in attendance figures, candidates in the Miss Liberty contest renewed activity in gathering votes for the honor of leading the fete of nations.

Good Season Ahead:

Auto dealers exhibiting cars at the exposition last night were unanimous in declaring that the coming season would witness pronounced activity in the automotive industry. In addition to sales made yesterday, a large number of inquiries testified to the keen interest taken by the public in the season's car offerings.

Today and tonight all previous attendance records are expected to be shattered, William Dohy, manager of the exposition, said. Because of adverse weather conditions the first few days of the week, hundreds of persons who had planned attending the show were unable to make their visits. This is expected to be one of the causes of record attendance tonight.

Ballot Box Stuffed.

Somebody stuffed the ballot box. Dan Tiffany came to life again. The battery man presided as judge in the jurisdiction of automotive. His sentence was that those who felt themselves guilty were to enter into a grand march at the show. O. O. Olson, who allowed the ballot box stuffing to be slipped over on him, was named as leader of the march, while Miss Spain, who failed to profit by the additional vote venture, was elected as his partner. They marched. The ballots which were accredited to one candidate, marked by the same hand (according to detectives), were not counted. The ballots counted showed the following results:
