

Rabbi Offers Nearby Towns Religious Aid

To provide help to the smaller communities in the organization of synagogues, religious schools, and study circles, Rabbi Alvin S. Luchs and I. Freimuth, president of Temple Emanuel, Duluth, will visit several cities on the range and other sections of the state. The visits will be made as part of the religious campaign being carried on by the Union of American Hebrew Congregations.

"The meetings are not to be conducted because we believe that there is a lack of religion among the Jewish people, but to help establish synagogues," Rabbi Luchs said. "Religion of all kinds is improving steadily, and the larger congregations should help organize synagogues in the smaller communities." Rabbi Luchs said that the campaign in this section of the state probably will start the first part of next week.

Rabbis and laymen from 150 cities will work during the campaign to bring spiritual aid to their coreligionists in cities which have no Jewish religious organizations, Rabbi Luchs explained.

The cities to be visited by Rabbi Luchs and Mr. Freimuth are Chisholm, Eveleth, Hibbing, Hurley, Mankato, Virginia and Winona.
