Miss Gladys Erickson Gives Birthday Party

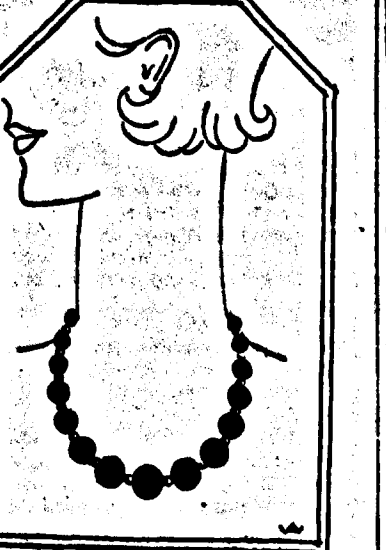

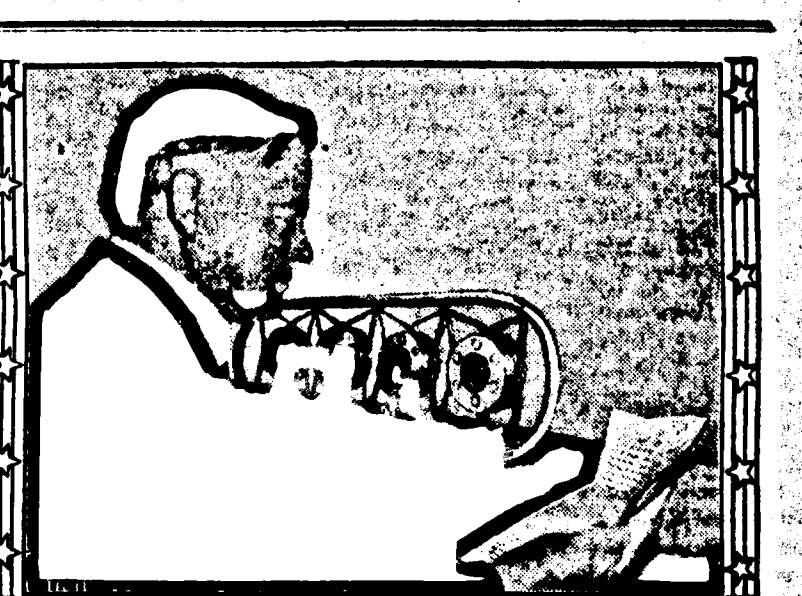
