

Bomb kills man trying to install it

Residents of a quiet west Contra Costa County neighborhood were awakened Saturday morning by broken windows, crashing pictures and a "big boom" caused by a man whose bomb exploded as he attempted to place it under a vehicle, police said.

"I'm still in shock. It was a scary thing," said Chris Heiderick, who woke up at 5:30 to the explosion down the street, west of Martinez in an unincorporated part of the county.

No residents were injured, but the unidentified man was killed by the blast, said Contra Costa County Sheriff's Sgt. Jim Hatchell.

"Reports of explosives are not unusual, but the actual detonation of a bomb is," Hatchell said.

He said the man was apparently attempting to put a bomb under a truck parked on Corte Del Sol Court when it went off in his hand. No motive has been established, Hatchell said.

Police said body parts were strewn along the street.

Neighbors who rushed to the scene were told to go back inside, said Heiderick.

Because the neighborhood of five homes is half a mile from a Shell Oil refinery, many thought the plant was the source of the explosion.

"I looked to see if it was a fire," said Heiderick. "I didn't see any-

thing. But later, when I went outside again, I figured police would tell us to evacuate. But they just said to go inside. I didn't really want to look.

"Nothing like this has ever happened out here," she said.

Heiderick said her van was dented during the explosion. The driver's side of the truck was severely damaged.

She said she did not know who might have planted the bomb, if the man lived in the neighborhood or whether he knew the owner of the truck that was bombed.

"It really frightened me because there are so many children on the court," she said. "If it happened any other time, I can't imagine what would have happened."

Assembly to get tough recycling bills

SACRAMENTO — Assembly Speaker Willie Brown said Saturday that Assembly leaders will introduce a package of bills this year to outlaw used-tire dumps, encourage recycling and restrict packaging that destroys ozone.

The San Francisco Democrat told radio listeners that the 23 mil-

lion used tires that Californians throw out every year should be recycled into rubberized asphalt, artificial reefs, retaining walls and other products.

Brown said proposed legislation would phase out the state's eight large used-tire piles, which he said become homes for rodents and mosquitoes and pose serious fire hazards.

He said other bills would restrict

packaging made from chemicals that destroy the earth's protective ozone layer, require the state government to buy more recycled materials and expand recycling opportunities.

"Each year in this country we throw away enough wood to build 1 million homes, discard enough paper to produce all of our newspapers, bury enough aluminum to build 500,000 house trailers," he said.

Champion terrier killed in mauling

A champion bull terrier mauled an Antioch woman before neighbors beat the dog to death, police report.

Officer Steve McConnell said Debra Ann Navarro, 18, was moving the dog from one pen to another in a garage Friday when the 50-pound animal lunged and bit her arms, legs and other parts of her body.

Police said Navarro was babysitting her young niece when the terrier attacked. The child ran for help, and neighbors Howard and Marvin Shelton responded, kicking

in the door. Unable to distract the animal with food, one of the men ran for a baseball bat and beat the dog to make it let go.

John Nenni, the dog owner's husband, said the terrier, named "Bogie," was a registered champion with the American Kennel Club. He described it as "a companion dog."

Nenni pointed out that bull terriers are smaller than pit bulls and are completely different from the dog with the killer record.

"He was a champion show dog," mourned Nenni. "They're very human-oriented. He was locked in his run, and she reached in to grab his collar. His run is like his castle."

San Jose

Rescued toddler 'extremely critical'

A San Jose youngster found alive after 20 minutes in an algae-laden swimming pool remained in a coma in "extremely critical condition" Saturday night but hopes grew that he would survive.

"I just talked with his neurosurgeon and he believes the boy will survive," San Jose Hospital spokeswoman Christi Welter said of the boy, Herbert Lopez, 2.

"The next 24 to 48 hours will be very important. He is in extremely critical condition," said Welter.

The boy began moving his eyelids for the first time since the accident, Welter said.

Doctors implanted an intracranial pressure monitor in the boy's brain to keep track of any swelling.

San Jose police Sgt. Robert Browning said the case would be reviewed by the district attorney's office to determine whether neglect charges will be filed against the boy's mother, Estella Lopez, 32.

Oakland

Residents saved by passers-by

Oakland fire officials Saturday praised passers-by who helped rescue residents from a burning Fruitvale home, including one who caught a child dropped from a second-floor window.

The one alarm blaze sent 14 residents to hospitals with smoke inhalation and minor injuries.

Battalion Chief Neil Honeycutt said one engine company arrived within a minute of the 10:35 a.m. alarm — and passers-by and neighbors already had rescued some peo-

ple by placing ladders against the two-story, eight-unit building at 3533 East 14th St.

A man saved his wife by tying her with a sheet and lowering her from a second-story window, he said.

He said the fire may have been started by a 4-year-old girl who was playing with matches. It destroyed a first-floor apartment and spread upstairs to the second floor and attic. Damage was estimated at \$50,000.

"These are the killer fires," he said. "A one-alarm fire doesn't sound like a big thing, but these are the fires that take lives."

Driver shot, left to die on off-ramp

A woman was fatally shot in the back of the head and left to die in her sports car on a state highway off-ramp, authorities said Saturday.

A Ventura County sheriff's deputy found Melinda Pate, 28, of Newberry Park in her Porsche 924 when he went to investigate why the car was pulled onto the shoulder of the Hillcrest Drive off-ramp from state Highway 23, said Sgt. Bob Larson.

Pate, who was unconscious when the deputy found her at 4:15 a.m. Saturday, was taken to Los Robles Regional Medical Center, where she was pronounced dead, Larson said.

Retired firefighter dies in house blaze

A retired San Francisco firefighter died Saturday morning when his second-floor apartment was gutted by a blaze, which fire officials said a cigarette may have ignited.

Battalion Chief Ed Ahrens said Melvin Petersen, a 31-year veteran who retired 20 years ago, died in

the fire at 525 Eureka St. The corner's office has not determined the exact cause of death.

The one-alarm fire, which started at about 8:15 a.m., was put out in 15 minutes, Ahrens said. The fire apparently started in the flat's front bedroom.

No other injuries were reported in the blaze, which caused an estimated \$90,000 damage.
