

Norman Cook Dies; Duluth Clothier

DULUTH — (AP) — Norman A. Cook, 54, Duluth merchant and president of the M. Cook and Sons stores of the Twin Cities and Duluth, died Sunday after a long illness.

He was a veteran of World War I, a member of the American Legion, the Masonic lodge and Duluth Shrine temple. He was past president of the Duluth Jewish federation.

He is survived by his wife, a son, Richard; a daughter, Gail, and two brothers, Theodore L., St. Paul, and Emanuel S., Los Angeles.

Funeral services will be held at 11 a.m. Tuesday at Duluth Temple Emanuel, with burial in Duluth.
