



Wendy Sue Nathanson

August 18, 1942 - November 29, 2023

Age, 81, the first of Milton and Toby Silvermann's three children, was born in Minneapolis on August 18, 1942. She died in Palm Springs, CA on November 29, 2023, after recent health complications. She was preceded in death by her parents and her former husband, Gary Nathanson, and is survived by her daughters, Andrea Nathanson and Debra Nathanson, and her granddaughter, Kayla Young, and great-granddaughters, Harper and Willa Young of Texas. Wendy's younger siblings, Amy and John Silvermann, both of Minneapolis, and her loving dog Bailey her bichon, survive her as well.

Wendy graduated from Northrop Collegiate, now the Blake School, in Minneapolis before attending the University of Minnesota, where she majored in French and Spanish, graduating in 1964. After the birth of her daughters, She began a career in the fashion industry where she excelled in 1970's, in the downtown la fashion mart. She developed and worked with a few famous lines, from Canyon Wear: chenille bathrobes and bedding some of which were featured on popular shows of the time, along with the fun and colorful Hot Sox, to name a few.

Later, she moved onto a second career in interior design at UCLA and dedicated the rest of her professional life to working in the home design and renovation industry where she worked with the Tomar Lambert design company of West Hollywood. In 2007 she launched her own firm, Studio West Interiors, and ran the business until retiring in September 2022. She took great pride in her final project, redesigning a home in the South of France, a task that brought her full circle in using the French she'd studied as an undergraduate.

Having recently moved to Rancho Mirage, CA only months ago, she was a long time resident of West Hollywood and enjoyed all the social interactions and entertainment the city provided: from shopping the latest fashions, dining out at the best restaurants, going to the theatre, and loved being part of a film club for years, traveling the world. Her biggest joy, was caring for and loving on the dogs she rescued, specifically Bichons.
