Services for Pamela Dunn Papermaster, Ph.D, 34, of Columbia, will be held at 11 a.m. Monday Feb. 14 at the Lakeshore Baptist Church in Shreveport. The Rev. She is survived by her husband, Dr. Benjamin Papermaster of Columbia; her parents, Woodrow and Mary Ruth Colvin Dunn of Shreveport; a sister, Mrs. Vickye Schaffer of Waynesville, Mo.; and two nieces and one nephew.
