# Robert Harris Rosenberg

January 7, 1926 - January 7, 2022

Following is the obituary as written by our father, Bob Rosenberg:

Dr. Rosenberg was born in Winona, Minnesota January 7, 1926 to Arthur and Sarah Kaner Rosenberg and raised in Minneapolis after age 7. He died on his 96th birthday, January 7, 2022.

Over the years he was known by various names and titles from family, friends and colleagues: Bobby, Robert, Rosie, Bob; Brother, Husband; Daddy, Dad, Grandpa; US Army Air Corp Veteran of WWII; student: Bachelor of Science 1949, Bachelor of Medicine 1951, M.D. 1952, all from the University of Minnesota; Doctor; Intern Harborview, Seattle 1951-52; Resident in Radiology, University of California, 1952-55, San Francisco; Radiologist Harborview 1955-1958; Clinical Associate Professor of Radiology, University of Washington; President Washington State Radiological Society, and the Radiological Society of North America; Practicing Member Seattle Radiologists 1957-1987; Member Temple Beth Am 53 years; Retiree, 1987; Resident Aljoya Thornton Place where he enjoyed living since 2009; and Patient too many times.

In 1998 he married Jane Fein, widow of a colleague, inherited a lovely large second family, and he and Jane traveled abroad. Jane passed in 2013 in Kline Galland Home after a long illness, widower again...

His last days in Aljoya were brightened by a special friend, Sunnie, and Titus, his loyal aide who provided excellent care for him and the special needs he had acquired. Now as you read this, finally...deceased.
