ISSOULA – Elsie M. Poster was born to Mike and Anna Baron Poster on July 6, 1927, in International Falls, Minnesota. She graduated from Falls High School in 1946 and promptly married her childhood sweetheart, Wilfred Steingas, on June 15, 1946, in Virginia, Minnesota.

"Willie" and Elsie arrived in Missoula in August 1948 by train with their 1-year-old daughter, looking for a job and some adventure. Missoula was the first stop, and Willie found a position as pressman at the University of Montana. They never moved out of the Missoula area after that.

Elsie never worked outside the home, but had her hands full with seven children and a busy household. She loved to cook, garden, and can fruits and vegetables. The family loved to travel with vacations taking them from East Coast to West, and Canada to the

Gulf of Mexico, often with the family camping trailer in tow and with any number of the children. Seeley Lake and the National Bison Range in Moiese were favorite local destinations. She was a longtime member of the Missoula Seventh-day Adventist Church, served as a teacher in children's Sabbath School classes and as a deaconess, and was active in other church activities.

Elsie passed away at home in Missoula on Saturday, June 27, 2015, just nine days before her 88th birthday. Willie had passed away just 22 days earlier on June 5. They would have been married for 69 years on June 15.

A family graveside service will be held at 10 a.m. Friday, July 10, at Sunset Memorial Gardens on Mullan Road. A memorial service will be held at 4 p.m. Saturday, July 11, at the Missoula Seventh-day Adventist Church at 800 South Ave. W.
