Teener, Sophie age 101, of Golden Valley, passed away November 11, 2017. Sophie grew up in North Minneapolis in a Yiddish speaking home. She graduated from North High School and Beth Hamidrash of Minneapolis Talmud Torah. She was a soprano soloist of Beth El Synagogue choir for 35 years. Sophie auditioned and was accepted as a member of the Solo Choir under the direction of Professor Donald

Aird of the U o M, where she also learned to sing in Latin. Sophie served as the youngest president of the Women's Auxiliary of the Oak Park Home, formerly the Jewish Sheltering Home for Children. Sophie loved the Yiddish language and joined the first Yiddish speaking group at the Jewish Community Center called "Lomir Redden Yiddish", which later evolved into the Yiddish Vinkl. She was an active member of the Tuesday Shmoozday Yiddish group, which also was at the Jewish Community Center. Sophie taught herself to read Yiddish at age 90. Her mother, Batyah, lived with Sophie's family until age 94. Sophie joined her husband, Jerry, in the family business, Teener's Theatrical Department Store, where she was active for 30 years, until it was sold, and she retired at age 86. Sophie is preceded in death by her loving husband of 56 years, Jerome "Jerry" Teener; parents, Batyah and Julius Gerb; daughter, Susan Calof; and brother, Louis Gerb.
